

The preceptor will provide direct supervision of technical skills with gradually increased autonomy in accordance with the student's demonstrated level of expertise. First and second year medical students will always be directly supervised (supervising physician or designee present or immediately available). Third- and fourth-year medical students will be supervised at a level appropriate to the clinical situation and student's level of experience. For some tasks, indirect supervision may be appropriate for some students. Direct supervision would be appropriate for advanced procedures. The supervising physician or provider may only supervise procedures in which they hold privileges and that are within their scope of practice.

Prior to engaging in curricular and co-curricular clinical activities students must comply with the following, failure to do so may adversely impact a student's ability to meet their graduation requirements.

- 1. Must complete the pre-matriculation physical exam and the annual immunization requirements prior to being allowed to participate inclinical experiences.
- Must complete online training required by the University and clinical setting including, but not limited to Heath Insurance Portability and Accountability Act (HIPAA) and Occupational Safety and Health Administration (OSHA) training before being allowed to participate in clinical experiences.
