Documentation is required to provide adeque information thatestablishes the presence of a disability and the functional impact on major life activities ong with justification of the need for requested accommodations Documentation must be recented accurately describe the current effects on the student. If documentation is inadequate in scope or conteant does not support the presence of a disability and need for accommodation bisability Services may reige additional information.

The professional providing documentation for the student must be **qedit** diagnose the disability and recommend appropriate accommodation the name, title, and professional credentials of the provider, including information about license or certification, area of specialization, and state in which the individual practice, must be clearly stated in the documentation is not appropriate for professionals to provide documentation members of their families all submitted documents should be on letterhead, typed, dated, signed, and otherwise legited phone calls medical records, and brief letters are not sufficient.

A diagnosis alone will not necessarily establish disability status or warrant accommodations under state and federal laws. Accommodations must be necessary, reasonational expression of the state of th

Precenting liagnosis inecessary and iagnostic categorization or classification of the ICD or LSM is preferred. Diagnosis should indicate primary, secondary, etc., and significant findings.
