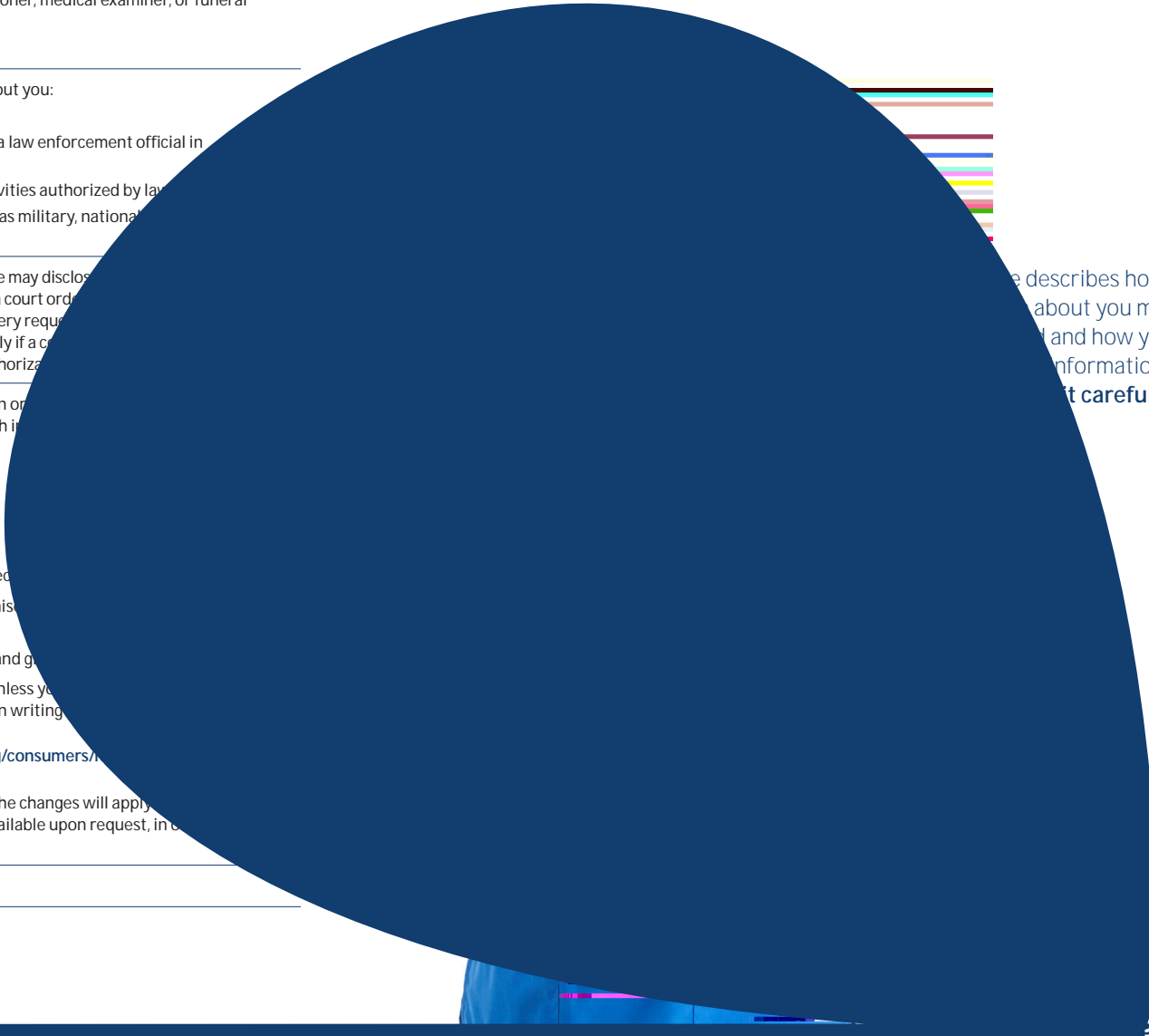


Do research	We can use or share your information for health research.
Comply with the law	We will share information about you if state or federal laws require it, including with the Department of Health and Human Services if it wants to see that we're complying with federal privacy law.
Respond to organ and tissue donation requests	We can share health information about you with organ procurement organizations.
Work with a medical examiner or funeral director	We can share health information with a coroner, medical examiner, or funeral director when an individual dies.
Address workers' compensation, law enforcement, and other government requests	We can use or share health information about you: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> For workers' compensation claims. For law enforcement purposes or with a law enforcement official in certain circumstances. With health oversight agencies for activities authorized by law. For special government functions such as military, national security, and presidential protective services.
Respond to lawsuits and legal actions	If you are involved in lawsuits or disputes, we may disclose health information (PHI) about you in response to a court order or subpoena about you in response to a subpoena, discovery request, or deposition of someone else involved in the dispute, but only if a court order requires us to protect the information requested or an authorized official has determined that the information is necessary.
Correctional Facilities	If you are an inmate of a state or local prison or a person in the custody of a law enforcement official, we may disclose health information to the facility or to a law enforcement official.

We will not use or share your information other than as described here unless you give us your permission. If you tell us we can, you may change your mind at any time. Let us know in writing.
