Goals:

The goabf the Student Clinic is to the student direct patient care experience under the guidance of preceptors. Students will be present for a least two patient care sessions. This experiences aimed at ntegration of osteopathic principles in patient care.

Objectives:

- 4. Perform an osteopathic structural exam as part of an integrated physical exam.
- 5. Verbally present the patient to the attending in an accurate and concise manner.
- 6. Write an accurate and organized targeted history and physical exam note as well as a targeted SOAP note which w
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- 7. Perform Osteopathic Manipulative Treatment with the guidance of the preceptor.
- 8. Address family medicine issues appropriately.
